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CM inaugurates regional conclave of State disaster management authorities

GANGTOK, October 14:
Chief Minister P.S. Golay today inaugurated the second regional conclave of State disaster management authorities of Himalayan and North-Eastern States here in the capital.

The conclave is being attended by 13 States and Union Territories, namely, Sikkim, Mizoram, Uttarakhand, Assam, Tripura, Himachal Pradesh, West Bengal, Nagaland, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh.

Addressing the inaugural session, the Chief Minister said the State government is continuously working together with all the Himalayan States and other stakeholders to establish a new disaster risk reduction framework for the regions.

He mentioned that the loss of forest cover weakens nature's ability to withstand extreme weather events and all should collectively work to strengthen and protect the ecosystems and invest more in environmental and climate resilience.

He informed that the Sikkim government has taken necessary steps to protect the environment by implementing various environment-friendly policies.

The mountain States have their perils and hazards which vary from the plains and landslide is a perennial phenomenon affecting the people and livelihoods,

transport and communication, and other sectors, he added

Further, Golay thanked the NDMA and Ministry of Home Affairs officials for being prompt and have been responsive in all instances and said it may be pertinent to have a separate set of items and norms for the hilly mountainous States considering the peculiar features and the fragile landscape.

The CM informed that there are numerous areas in all the six districts of the State which are vulnerable to major slips and require immediate intervention and mitigation to save lives and properties.

He expressed his gratitude to the Central government and said that under the dynamic leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi there has always been a helping hand and firm patronage to the State in several difficult situations.

Land Revenue and Disaster Management minister Kunga Nima Lepcha said that disaster is a severe climate and ecosystem destruction that destroys the beauty and natural vegetation of a region. It can be either man-made or natural and the number of disasters is rising very quickly, he added.

The minister stated that certain dynamic steps should be taken to monitor the

situation before the disaster worsens the nature and lives of the people. He requested everyone to come out of their comfort zone and join hands with the government to help protect and preserve the environment to avoid natural calamities.

member and NDMA secretary (I/C) Kamal Kishore, in his keynote address, talked about the mitigation of natural disasters. He said most of the calamities are taking place due to negligence. The calamities have affected the livelihoods of the people and to curb tragic disasters the state should Sustainable follow Development Goals, he added. All social infrastructures like schools, hospitals and offices should be built with earthquake resistance and landslide protection, he suggested.

He also talked about community alignments and said that it is very necessary to be connected with the community for the functioning of early warning systems which helps to take adaptive measures for climate change, using integrated communication systems to help communities to prepare for hazardous calamities.

The speaker also stressed the importance of earthquake clinics where the concerned authorities will train people about the significance of earthquake resistant construction.

On the occasion, the Chief Minister handed the draft report of Lumsey landslide to the officials of NDMA and MHA.
