

CM chairs SSDMA meeting



GANGTOK, January 27

(IPR): After a long interval, the meeting of Sikkim State Disaster Management Authority (SSDMA) was conducted under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Prem Singh Tamang at Samman Bhawan today.

Minister, Land Revenue and Disaster Management department, Kunga Nima Lepcha, chief secretary, Government of Sikkim, S.C. Gupta, Director General of Police, N.K. Mishra, State Relief Commissioner- cum- secretary, Land Revenue and Disaster Management department, Sarala Rai, and other dignitaries and members

of SSDMA were present in the meeting.

Action taken report of SSDMA of 2016 was briefly discussed which was followed by the presentation on activities of SSDMA on the roadmap ahead. Likewise, the National Disaster Relief Fund / State Disaster Relief Fund was presented by the director, SSDMA.

The members apprised the Chief Minister about the revised State Disaster Management Plan (SDMP) and also placed the proposal to constitute the committee to monitor and supervise the project under SDMF.

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The house also placed the proposal for the constitution of the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMAs) in the newly created districts of Pakyong and Soreng.

Several ongoing programs, projects, and schemes were also discussed which included landslide early warning system at Chandmari, extension of emergency response system, transformational project pipelines for Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC) implementation,

common alerting protocol project, and National Disaster Information Management System (NDMIS).

The members also had an open house discussion in the meeting where they put forward the suggestions and agendas for further implementation.

The Chief Minister also suggested a few points and recommended that the members take them into consideration. He also emphasized the importance of

identifying the disaster hotspots and deliberating on mitigating them.

The meeting was also addressed by minister Kunga Nima Lepcha, who spoke about the importance of the SSDMA in mitigating and monitoring calamities within the State and insisted on conducting the meeting on regular basis.

As suggested, it was decided that the SSDMA meetings will now be held before and after the monsoon season.
