'Culprit will be arrested and strict action shall be initiated'

NAMCHI, January 29 (IPR): IPR minister Lok Nath Sharma today led a joint inspection of Eco Heritage Film Village, at Yangang wherein a theatre was set on fire by unknown miscreants on Friday.

Sharma and the team minutely inspected the indoor theatre which was gutted down to ashes and enquired about the loss of the damaged properties in detail.

Thereafter, the visiting inspected team infrastructures of Eco Heritage Film Village which were found abandoned and broken down into fragments.

Speaking to the media, Sharma strongly condemned the fire incident that has caused huge damage to the government property.

He also mentioned that the IPR DIO (South) had lodged an FIR at Yangang police station immediately after the incident and police investigation has already governmentalways encourages started. He assured that the culprit will be arrested and strict action shall be initiated.



He added that the joint visit was carried out immediately after receiving directives from the Chief Minister to take stock of the situation.
