EXPRESS, the panchayat president shared the landslide has blocked the approach road to Beng village from Thangsing side besides damaging vegetables, cash crops like oranges and water supply lines.

A taxi and a bike were also buried by the mudslide, she said adding no injuries or loss of life was reported.

It was also reported that a farmer had around 25 pigs and out of them, only three pigs

survived the mudslide, said Lepcha. She informed that the local BDO and officials from Roads & Bridges department visited the spot and took a

report of the damages.

social worker G.M. Gurung from Rangpo, in a press statement, mentioned that the incessant rains have trigged mudslides causing partial to heavy damage to lands, agriculture, vehicles and properties at Beng ward. We appeal the authorities to give compensation at the earliest and initiate relief measures for the affected villagers of Beng, he said.

Gurung shared that villagers of Beng are simple, hardworking farmers and depended on vegetable cultivation and animal husbandry for their livelihood.
